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part history part legend this is the story of sundiata keita the heroic figure who founded the empire of mali a thirteenth century oral epic sundiata sees the full length tale captured in print for the first time this is sundiata the epic tale of a man great among kings who through his legendary deeds and exploits came to father an empire for over 800 years this story has been passed down to generations of listeners through spoken word d t niane s novelisation captures all the mystery and majesty of medieval african kingship this ambitious story ranks alongside the ancient greek and roman classics as one of the world s great adventure stories

the son of sogolon the hunchback princess and maghan known as the handsome sundiata grew up to fulfill the prophecies of

the soothsayers that he would unite the twelve kingdoms of mali into one of the most powerful empires ever known in africa which at its peak stretched right across the savanna belt from the shores of the atlantic to the dusty walls of timbuktu retold by generations of griots the guardians of african culture this oral tradition has been handed down from the thirteenth century and captures all the mystery and majesty of medieval african kingship it is an epic tale part history and part legend

this collection of essays introduces students of african literature to the heritage of the african prose narrative starting from its oral base and covering its linguistic and cultural diversity the book brings together essays on both the classics and the relatively new works in all subgenres of the african prose narrative including the traditional epic the novel the short story and the autobiography the chapters are arranged according to the respective thematic paradigms under which the discussed works fall

a broad range of cultural works produced in traditional and modern african communities shows a fundamental preoccupation with the concepts of communal solidarity and hospitality in societies driven by humanistic ideals african cultural production and the rhetoric of humanism is an inaugural attempt to focus exclusively and extensively on the question of humanism in african art and culture this collection brings together scholars from different disciplines who deftly examine the deployment of various forms of artistic production such as oral and written literatures paintings and cartoons to articulate an afrocentric humanist discourse the contributors argue that the artists in their representation of civil wars massive corruption poverty abuse of human rights and other dehumanizing features of post independence africa call for a return to the traditional african vision of humanism that is relentlessly being eroded by the realities of postcolonial nationhood

this book essentially negotiates african literature as a veritable site of artistic and cultural production and situates it within the dynamic of postcolonial cultural politics it critically evaluates african literature as a contour of cultural contestation with the imperial politics of knowledge production about others and as an ideological strategy for knowing them the book s main contribution to the critical discourse on african literature and culture inheres in the fact that politics constitutes the enduring concern of society as it re shapes and over determines discourses which have continued to remain crucial to societal engineering it however imagines the discursive existence as necessary for the evolving of a dynamic african literary tradition with an abiding fidelity to the verities of history the book is useful for literary scholars historians critics experts and students of postcolonial cultural studies as well as general readership interested in african studies

mali is one of the world s poorest nations and the second largest country of francophone west africa in 1883 it became a colony of france following independence in 1960 the country pursued an aggressive socialist programme under the leadership of modibo keita who was overthrown in a bloodless military coup in 1968 four coup attempts followed in the 1970s and 1980s as well as a highly publicized student strike and two disastrous droughts mall continues to be troubled by political and social tensions this annotated bibliography the first on mall to be published in english provides extensive coverage of english and french language publications on all aspects of the country
